Miss Faith will be leading our elementary age children as they paint a fall-themed ceramic or foam figurine. Registration opens on October 4th. Please note to register each child individually.




Lego League

Pages & Paws with Chloe the Therapy Dog




Printmaking & Bookbinding for Adults
